

City of Patterson Stormwater Management Program (M.C. 13.32)

Stormwater discharges are regulated in California under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit. The Water Board draws authority and direction from the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (Clean Water Act). The Municipal Stormwater Permitting Program regulates stormwater discharges from Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4). Stormwater System drains directly to the San Joaquin River with **NO** treatment.

On April 30, 2003, the State required small MS4 municipalities (population less than 100,000) to obtain coverage under the Phase II Permit. In 2003 the City of Patterson obtained coverage and adopted their Stormwater Ordinance No. 653 & No. 777 and began their Stormwater Management Program (Municipal Code Section 13.32). The program's goal is to manage/mitigate rainwater and stormwater at the source and prevent pollution from entering the City's storm drain system/waterways and improve water quality. The City's program elements include:

1. Public Education & Outreach
2. Public Involvement & Participation
3. Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination Program
4. Construction Site Storm Water Runoff Control & Outreach Program
5. Pollution Prevention & Good Housekeeping Program
6. Post-Construction Storm Water Management Program
