## Public Safety

5/29 – Meeting with Patterson Fire Department Employees – Discussion centered on multiple upcoming changes to the organization moving forward and ensuring we do all we can to hire Firefighter Paramedics when possible.

5/30 – CARE homeless outreach – The CARE team engaged with our homeless community for their weekly outreach here in Patterson.

5/31 – Project Resolve meeting – The City of Patterson attended the meeting, which focuses on trying to forge a better understanding of what residents need from law enforcement and how law enforcement can better provide it.

6/2 – Meeting with a community member at City Hall – Meeting was regarding public safety concerns of the citizen and possible confidential information for the Sheriff. A follow-up meeting will be held with Chief of Police Josh Clayton.

6/8 – Meeting with a community member at their residence regarding street lighting – The meeting was to consider options to increase lighting in our downtown residential areas. Several options are being considered to improve lighting for downtown residents.

6/13 - Meeting with Chief of Police Clayton / Civil Issue – The issue at hand was a possible connection between a neighbor of the reporting party and connection between the original incident and one from another community. Follow up will be conducted along with an attempt to contact the involved party.

6/15 – CARE Quarterly Meeting – The Stanislaus County CARE team has regularly scheduled meetings to review progress and general program effectiveness. The City of Patterson had 132 total contacts during the reporting period. Ten Clients have been contacted multiple times and nine have accepted at least one service.

6/16 – Follow up meeting with a community member and Chief of Police Clayton – This was a follow up meeting from 6/2. Information was provided to the Sheriff's Office and the citizens' concerns were addressed.



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6/17 – K9 Association Dinner with Chance Condit – Mayor Pro Tem Roque attended the dinner to celebrate the contribution of K-9 Officers who protect our communities.

6/20 – CARE homeless outreach - The CARE team engaged with our homeless community for their weekly outreach here in Patterson.
